### **COVID-19 Pandemic: Eight Months and Counting**

October Membership Program Discusses Where We've Been, Where We Are and Where We're Going...

The chamber's October 19 virtual membership meeting program will delve deep into the COVID-19 pandemic and the impacts we've been living with for nearly eight months. The virtual presentation will scan the big picture of the worldwide pandemic, but look closely at Douglas County.

Virtual attendees can expect a brief recap about where we've been since March, from shutdown to Phases 1 and 2, highlighting the efforts of the Douglas County COVID-19 Response Team, community partners and local citizens. The program will also provide an update of where we are now—have cases leveled off or are we seeing upticks in positive cases—and, what we, as businesses, citizens need to keep doing, start or stop doing to successfully reach Phase 3. And, a forecast of where are we're going, what we can expect in the unexpected world we live in.

Applications Due November 6

The Roseburg Area Chamber of Commerce is now accepting applications for 2020-21 Project Leadership Roseburg. If you or one of your employees are a future Douglas County business leader, then you'll want to be part of Project Leadership which will begin in September. The chamber is very proud of this long-standing program and this year marks our 32nd year! Since its inception, the chamber has graduated over 600 individuals from this distinguished professional development program.

Not your typical leadership program, the chamber's Project Leadership program provides participants with a comprehensive awareness of Douglas County and a deeper understanding of how our community works directly from our business and community leaders. The six-month, seven workshops program shares knowledge about our region and fosters dedication to our community as participants learn about how they can get involved to help create a more vibrant future for Douglas County.

Project Leadership is a two-year commitment for participants. During the first year, participants attend a day-long session each month from January 2021 through June 2021 (two in April). The full-day workshops range from panel presentations to tours on a variety of subjects and include leadership and teambuilding activities.

### Project Leadership Roseburg (Continued)

The subjects include in-depth glimpses at economic drivers such as natural resources, manufacturing, tourism, education and the health care industry, to name a few. Participants will be the chamber's guests at the annual awards dinner in March and, of course, graduation at next June's membership luncheon. Due to state mandates, some portions of the classes may be done virtually through Zoom conference calls. After participants "graduate" from Project Leadership Roseburg in June 2021 they will support chamber staff with facilitation of a workshop session for a new class of participants, thus fulfilling their second-year commitment to the program.

The Roseburg Area Chamber is accepting applications now, please keep in mind space is limited. Applicants may be either employer or self-sponsored. The cost for the program is \$700 for members of the Roseburg Area Chamber and \$900 for non-members. Roseburg Area Chamber members are given priority. # What's Happening in Timber & Wood Products

The Roseburg Area Chamber of Commerce's monthly membership luncheon programs are scheduled to resume on Monday, September 14th. The August program will be an update on the timber and wood products industry, presented by Grady Mulbery, president & CEO of Roseburg Forest Products. Mr. Mulbery's discussion will focus on federal timber legislation and current policy issues affecting the industry and information on current market trends, technological changes and any effects of COVID-19 pandemic in industry.

Mr. Mulbery has been president and CEO of Roseburg since 2016 and also serves on the company's board of directors. Grady joined the company in 2011 as vice president of composites manufacturing, and was soon appointed to oversee all manufacturing facilities throughout the company, including composites, lumber, engineered wood, plywood and veneer.



#### Then now is the time to apply for participation in the 2021 Project Leadership Roseburg program.

Since 1989, more than 600 business men and women have graduated from Project Leadership Roseburg, and many of today's respected Douglas County business and civic leaders are graduates of this esteemed program. Now in its 32<sup>nd</sup> year, the mission of the Roseburg Area Chamber of Commerce's leadership program is to educate, inspire, and strengthen community-minded individuals through increased business and community awareness and to promote civic activism through volunteerism.

Not your typical leadership program, Project Leadership provides participants with a comprehensive awareness of the many facets of Douglas County and they gain a deeper understanding of how our community works, directly from its leaders. The eight-month program not only imparts knowledge about our region, but fosters dedication to our community as participants learn about opportunities for involvement to help create a more vibrant future for Douglas County. Due to COVID -19 pandemic, the 2021 program will be six months (January through June), with seven workshops (two in April).

#### Making a Commitment to Leadership

Project Leadership Roseburg requires a two-year commitment from participants. During the first year, participants attend seven day-long sessions each month—from January through June (two workshops in April). Participants will attend a full-day workshop, panel presentations/briefings, and/or tours on different session topics.

Project Leadership challenges its participants to become more involved in local politics, the chamber, community and civic organizations—all for the future betterment of Douglas County. This involvement will start soon after participants "graduate" from the leadership program in May. They will assist chamber staff with facilitation of workshop sessions for a new class of Project Leadership participants; thus, fulfilling their second year commitment to the program.

#### **Now Accepting Applications**

The chamber is currently accepting applications for the 2021 Project Leadership class. Space is limited. Applicants may be employer-sponsored or self-sponsored. The cost for the program for Roseburg Area Chamber members is \$700; the cost for non-member participants is \$925. Roseburg Area Chamber members will be given priority and acceptance is on a first-come/first-approved basis. Only one candidate per company may be accepted. **Please Note**: Some panel discussions may include zoom meeting teleconferencing in order to comply with state mandates due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
