#### **Economic Shutdown Continues for Douglas County**

**Douglas County at Extreme Risk Level.** Yesterday, Governor Brown announced updates to county risk levels under the state's new public health framework to reduce transmission of COVID-19. As we shared with you, our members, last week, the framework uses four different risk levels for counties based on COVID-19 spread—Extreme Risk, High Risk, Moderate Risk and Lower Risk. Each risk level has <u>assigned health and safety measure mandates</u>. These mandated measures are effective Thursday, December 3 and will remain through December 17. The Oregon Health Authority will examine and publish county data weekly. County risk levels will be reassigned every two weeks, with the next risk assignment levels taking effect on December 18.

Twenty-five counties have been determined to be in the Extreme Risk, including Douglas County, which means we will continue with the economic shutdown currently in place. A complete list of counties and their associated risk levels is available **here**.

### <u>Chamber to Launch No-Cost PPE Distribution Program Next</u> <u>Week</u>

Partnership between the City of Roseburg and the Roseburg Area Chamber will provide personal protective equipment (PPE) at no cost to Roseburg area businesses. The limited-quantity PPE to be offered will include: 3-ply ear-loop disposal masks, washable reusable cloth masks, non-surgical KN95 masks, pump-bottle hand sanitizer, antibacterial wipes and disposable nitrile gloves.

To receive the no-cost PPE, businesses **must apply through the chamber's website** and demonstrate that they were financially impacted by COVID-19. The program is set to launch on or about December 10. Applications **will be** available on the **Roseburg Chamber website** once the PPE distribution program is "live." Next week, check your inbox and the chamber website for eligibility criteria and application links. Once launched, application information will also be posted on the city's website.

#### **NEW OSHA COVID-19-Related Resources Available**

Oregon OSHA has released a <u>Fact Sheet</u> for the COVID-19 Temporary Rule for All Workplaces as well as a <u>question and answer document</u> regarding the rule that went into effect on November 16. It is important to understand these provisions and what your responsibilities are as an Oregon employer.

Oregon OSHA's temporary rule for COVID-19 (OAR 437-001-0744) <u>requires all employers to</u> <u>develop and implement an infection control plan</u>. This plan builds upon each employer's exposure risk assessment, which the rule also requires, and aims to eliminate or otherwise minimize worker exposure to COVID-19. The exposure risk assessment and infection control plan need to be completed in writing for those employers with more than 10 employees by December 7.

# **Douglas County to Receive \$1,473,569 for Local Business Assistance Fund**

As you know, to help mitigate the financial impact "the freeze" will have on Oregon businesses, Governor Brown announced last week that she has directed \$55 million in Coronavirus Relief Funds to help those required to close.

The funds will be allocated to counties, with each county receiving a base of \$500,000 plus a per capita allocation of the remainder of the funds. The counties will be responsible for deciding how businesses apply to receive funds and communicating the application process to businesses. The Governor's office anticipates that the funds will be distributed to counties within the next several weeks. Douglas County's share of those funds for local business assistance has been determined to be \$1,473,569. County leadership is in the process of developing its business assistance grant application criteria and process.
