2021 Oregon Legislative Session Begins January 19

The 2021 Oregon legislative session is scheduled to being on Tuesday, January 19. Check out the **2021 legislative calendar**. Following are some key dates that will govern the 160-day session:

Tuesday, Feb 23: Bill introduction deadline

• Friday, March 19: Original committee "work session" posting deadline

• Tuesday, April 13: Original committee "work session" deadline

• Friday, May 14: Second chamber "work session" posting deadline

Friday, May 28: Second chamber "work session" deadline
Friday, June 18: Leadership's targeted date for Sine Die

• Sunday, June 27: Constitutional Sine Die

Here's what we know so far about how the session will be conducted. The session will be virtual through at least early March. The first reassessment will be made on March 1. The only way the Capitol will be reopened is when Marion County enters the lowest of the COVID risk categories. Currently, Marion County is in the highest risk category.

Right now there appears to be more standing committees meeting a little less frequently than usual. There will be more advance notice for hearings and work sessions. Although there are no bill limits this session (we understand nearly 3,000 bills have been introduced to date), there will be more prioritization and likely fewer bills being considered. There are indications that budgets won't be addressed until later in the session due to uncertainty around revenue and potential federal aid packages.

House and Senate committees for the 2021 session have been released.

Yesterday, December 22, the U.S. Chamber created a new <u>Guide to Small Business COVID-19</u> <u>Emergency Loans</u> to provide local chambers and our members with the latest information and answers to FAQs about the changes that have been made to the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) and the Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL) Program as part of the end-of-year pandemic relief package Congress passed and which is tentatively slated to become law.

Oregon OSHA Grants Grace-Period for Compliance with New COVID-19 Rules

The recently adopted <u>Oregon OSHA Temporary COVID-19 rule</u> includes a series of deadlines, including three inter-related requirements. Under the rule, employers must complete both the required <u>Risk Assessment</u> and the <u>Infection Control Plan</u> based on that Risk Assessment by December 7, 2020 and must complete the required <u>Infection Control Training</u> (based in part on the Infection Control Plan) by December 21, 2020.

A three-week implementation delay has been granted for certain employers – including restaurants, gyms and other businesses impacted the recent "freeze" and by the newly adopted risk levels. All other employers who have been working to comply but have not yet completed that work are granted a one-week grace period. You can read more about this in <u>OR-OSHA's memo</u>.
