OSHA's Vaccine Mandate-or-Test Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS) Reinstated

On Friday, December 17, the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals reinstated the Biden Administration's rules mandating employers with 100 or more employees to require workers to either be vaccinated or

complete weekly testing for COVID-19. It was expected the Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS) would be on hold pending legal challenges, but a federal appeals court overturned the stay.

Updated information has been posted on the OSHA ETS website at <u>OSHA.gov</u>. With this decision, OSHA has now pushed both initial ETS effective dates out 5 weeks stating it "will not issue citations for noncompliance with any requirements of the ETS before January 10 and will not issue citations for noncompliance with the standard's testing requirements before February 9, so long as an employer is exercising reasonable, good faith efforts to come into compliance with the standard."

Oregon is a state with its own OSHA program. As such, <u>Oregon OSHA</u> has jurisdiction over workplace health and safety in the state. What a new federal standard triggers is a requirement that Oregon OSHA adopts a rule that is "at least as effective" as the federal version.

To be considered "as least as effective" as federal OSHA, Oregon OSHA is required to adopt the same or similar standard by January 24, 2022. Like the federal standard, the anticipated effective date of the Oregon standard would be 30 days from adoption.

The chamber will keep you, our members, advised regarding Oregon OSHA's adopted ETS as soon as we have that information.
