Call to Action: Support Small Business

Legislative bills would provide tax relief to Oregon small business. The business community has a real opportunity to impact positive change in the legislature this session which would provide tax relief to thousands of small businesses across Oregon.

In the wake of a global pandemic, businesses across Oregon have continued to weather challenges like workforce shortages and economic uncertainty. The business community has rallied behind two bills, HB 2433 and SB 127, which would increase the exemption in the Corporate Activity Tax (CAT) from \$1 million to \$5 million for small businesses. This timely legislation would provide much needed tax relief to thousands of small businesses across Oregon.

This is one of the most important issues the Oregon State Chamber of Commerce (OSCC) and chambers throughout Oregon are supporting this session. As it stands, 72% of businesses filing are under \$5 million in commercial activity. However, they only account for 6.5% of total CAT revenue. If enacted, this would have a direct impact on the majority of small businesses in the state.

Chambers and small businesses raised the flag, and legislators are listening. We encourage you to send a letter to your legislator and let them know that increasing the exemption in the CAT would truly make a difference in supporting local economies and keeping small businesses alive. The legislature needs to help turn Oregon into a more business-friendly state.

The Roseburg Area Chamber of Commerce has submitted a letter in support of HB 2433 and SB 127, but legislators need to hear from our members on the real-life impact this has on your business and the other businesses in our community. The most important thing you can share is your personal business story. The Oregon State Chamber of Commerce has provided a portal to submit your letter with additional information about the CAT tax.
