

2023 RACC ACTIVITIES/ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Advocated for in defense of our local business community under the chamber's 2023-24 Public Affairs & Legislative Agenda, specifically during the 2023 Oregon Legislative Session, submitting in testimony in opposition to anti-business legislation and in support of pro-business legislation.
- Filed two *Amicus* briefs in the United States Supreme Court in support of petitions for certiorari. The chamber's briefs were founded in its long-standing interest and advocation for active management of public forestland for all designated purposes mandated under the O & C Act of 1937 and its opposition to Cascade-Siskiyou Nat'l Monument designation and proposed habitat conservation plan.
- The chamber's membership lunch programs hosted the annual state of the county update, local efforts to mitigate impacts of homelessness, a discussion with Oregon's new BOLI Commissioner, timber health, Wildlife Safari update, timber and wood products industry update and more.
- Provided membership significant political awareness, especially during the 2023 Oregon legislative sessions via newsletter articles, "Call to Action" and "Chamber News" emails, and membership meeting programs.
- Expanded the chamber's financial stability. Due to long-term conscientious management of chamber funds, including ensuring emergency operations reserves, the Roseburg Area Chamber of Commerce remains financially stable and secure.
- Represented the interests of business with government monitoring federal, state and local political activity, taking positions when appropriate.
- Continued growth of social media posts, member email blasts and website updates to expand communication of chamber programs, activities and positions to businesses and the general public.
- Regular updates of chamber's website and printed collateral materials for the service to and promotion of members.
- Continued to grow chamber communications, specifically its electronic newsletter, "Chamber News" emails and "Calls to Action"; produced six editions of *Business Perspectives* in addition to current news on website.
- Hosted the chamber's 68th annual awards dinner and meeting of the membership presenting RACC's small, medium and large business of the year awards, business innovative excellence honors and First Citizen recognitions for 2022.
- Publish updated, online editions of the *InUmpqua* (business directory, community profile & visitor magazine); continued to provide printed edition to chambers and visitor centers around the state.
- Completed 33rd year of Project Leadership Roseburg, and began the 2023-24 (34th year) leadership class program in September 2023.
- Member-benefit programs: Shop Chamber & Save discount program, member referrals, groundbreakings/ribbon cutting events.
- "Shop local" messaging; promoted "shop local" for Black Friday and "shop small" on Small Business Saturday and throughout the holiday season, during November and December.
- Provided visitor information to individuals interested in visiting Roseburg/Douglas County in response to mail, phone and email inquiries.
- Provided relocation information and packets to individuals and businesses in response to mail, phone and email requests.
- Distributed Roseburg/Douglas County map locally, regionally and statewide, and to individuals planning to visit and/or relocate to our area.

RACC PRIORITIES

Our Vision: To advocate for and be the voice of the business community in the greater Roseburg area.

Our Mission: To strengthen, enhance and protect our members through political advocacy, economic development, community promotion and member programs and services.

While the chamber's priorities and objectives are continually under review to best serve local business, every year Roseburg Area Chamber of Commerce leadership plans to determine its primary objectives and priorities for the upcoming year and the future. The chamber's key priorities are:

- Advocate for business during Oregon's 2024 Legislative Session under RACC's 2023-2024 Public Affairs & Legislative Agenda; provide written or in-person testimony on proposed legislation; and, participate with local, regional and state-wide coalitions to oppose anti-business and support pro-business initiatives.
- Promote member businesses products and services through referrals, online member directory and printed directory, social media posts, "Shop local" promotion and member brochures on information floor. Provide members with promotional opportunities through sponsorships, advertising and website corporate banners.
- Continue to expand online business resource libraries with crucial information and information for best general business practices. Add business programs to provide members with best practices information.
- Add chamber staff prioritizing membership growth, member outreach and retention, and increasing member-business visitations.
- Identify and solicit candidates, as needed, for local races, utilizing our candidate endorsement process during the 2024 election cycle to promote business-friendly candidates for local and state offices.
- Monitor issues and activities at the local, state and federal government levels. Actively support and oppose issues in order to advance the most pro-business environment possible.
- Keep membership informed of government affairs issues, particularly during Oregon's Legislative Session via newsletter articles, broadcast "Call to Action" emails, membership email blast updates, website "Current News," and programs/ forums, as needed.
- Host chamber programs/events including annual awards dinner and meeting of the membership, membership meeting lunches, 2024-25 Project Leadership Roseburg and Economic Forecast 2025, and additional programs, as needed. Support our members ribbon cutting and grand opening events.
- Promote our community as a great place to live, work and visit through online information about recreation, events and amenities; statewide distribution of InUmpqua publication and Roseburg/Douglas County map; responding to phone, email and in-person inquiries and via mailing the chamber's *InUmpqua* magazine.
- Provide information to individuals and businesses looking to relocate through online, phone, email, mail and on-site inquiries and mailing of community profile and relocation information.
- Advocate for effective forest management on public lands to include increased harvest and reforestation, imperative to economic growth, long-term sustainability, and to curtail the significant increase in catastrophic wildfires seen in recent years; and advocate for proper management after a fire or other catastrophic event.
