Chamber Supports City of Roseburg's **Proposed UGB Expansion Land Swap**

At the March meeting of the Roseburg Area Chamber of Commerce board of directors, there was an unanimous vote in support of the city of Roseburg's proposed UGB expansion land swap.

The chamber's support is founded in the project's intention to increase residential development capacity to meet our community's current and future housing needs.



The chamber recognizes that our community is facing a significant

housing shortage. The chamber also understands that a shortage of housing is an impediment to local business growth and overall economic development endeavors. Available housing is key to local employers' ability to retain and attract people to work in our community. The lack of available housing in Roseburg and Douglas County is a barrier for business see UGB, page 5

The leadership program is open to both principals and employees of Roseburg Area Chamber of Commerce members. If you or one of your employees are a future Douglas County community and business leader, then you'll want to be part of Project Leadership Roseburg.

Chamber Coalition Supporting Small Business Input in Federal Rulemaking


The Roseburg Area Chamber of Commerce joined with local and state chambers throughout the country on the U.S. Chamber's coalition letter on Regulatory Flexibility Act reform in support of small business. The letter was sent to members of the U.S. House of Representatives' Committees on Small Business and of the Judiciary supporting reform in implementation of the Regulatory Flexibility Act on February 1, 2024. Roseburg Chamber Joins US Chamber Opposition to CARB Application

The U.S. Chamber of Commerce submitted a letter on April 10 to EPA Administrator Michael Regan, signed by more than 130 state and local chambers, including the Roseburg Area Chamber of Commerce, asking the EPA to deny the California Air Resources Board's application to exempt its In-Use Locomotive Regulation from the Clean Air Act. That move would require railroads to move to zero-emission locomotives in some cases by 2030 and in all cases by 2035, "even though the technologies necessary to achieve these reductions do not exist." The signers say the CARB rule "threatens the supply chain" and would force freight off the rails and onto roads, among other harms. Read the opposition letter HERE.

growth and for individuals interested in relocating to the Roseburg area.

The proposed UGB swap provides the opportunity to add housing development, which in turn provides economic benefits to our region. The chamber believes the concept of exchanging steep and inaccessible acres of land for lands more capable of development is an example of good government and planning. The costs of infrastructure and site development are significantly lower on relatively flat land as compared to the majority of Roseburg's existing vacant residential property that is on steep slopes. If approved, amending the UGB will provide the much-needed opportunity to increase available housing within Roseburg's city limits.

The chamber has had a long-standing government/ public affairs policy related to city urban growth boundary expansions or adjustments, stating that the chamber "will continue to support UGB expansion as it relates to business, commercial and industrial growth and development." The city of Roseburg's UGB swap proposal not only wholly aligns with the chamber's position on the issue, but is an effective solution to our community's housing development needs.

Now in its 35th year, the mission of the Roseburg Area Chamber of Commerce's leadership program is to educate, inspire, and strengthen community-minded individuals through increased business and community awareness and to promote civic activism through volunteerism.

Not your typical leadership program, Project Leadership provides participants with a comprehensive awareness of the many facets of Douglas County and they gain a deeper understanding of how our community works, directly from its leaders. The nine-month program not only imparts knowledge about our region, but fosters dedication to our community as participants learn about opportunities for involvement to help create a more vibrant future for Douglas County.

Making a Commitment to Leadership

Project Leadership Roseburg requires a two-year commitment from participants. During the first year, participants attend eight day-long sessions, one per month. Each month, participants will attend a full-day workshop, panel presentations/briefings, and/or tours on different session topics.

Project Leadership challenges its participants to become more involved in local politics, the chamber, community and civic organizations—all for the future betterment of Douglas County. This involvement will start soon after participants "graduate" from the leadership program in May. They may assist chamber staff with facilitation of workshop sessions for a new class of Project Leadership participants; thus, fulfilling their

second-year commitment to the program.

The chamber is currently accepting applications for the 2024-25 Project Leadership class. Space is limited. Applicants may be employer-sponsored or self-sponsored.
