The Session May Be Over, But the Work Continues

<u>ACTION ALERT!</u> Members will recall the tough fight during the regular session against SB 916, which grants unemployment insurance benefits to striking workers. Last month, the Oregon Employment Department (OED) proposed draft regulations to implement SB 916. While the proposed rules should be limited to implementing SB 916, the agency took the opportunity to rewrite Oregon's unemployment insurance law to the detriment of public and private employers. As currently written, the proposed rules:

- Give claimants the ability to create new restrictions on the types of work and schedules they are willing to accept.
- Eliminate the ability of the Director to require claimants to accept available work;
- Extend time limits: an absence or illness is not disqualifying unless it takes up more than half of the
- Eliminate restrictions on UI related to incarcerations or drug treatment.
- Make significant changes the division's interpretation of "actively" looking for work:
 - Create a new standard for claimants that are "employer attached" and eliminates current four-week limit on temporary layoffs
 - Create a blanket interpretation that employees are "actively" looking for work when they are unemployed due to a labor dispute and there is an expectation they will return to work when the strike ends
- Allow employees to seek only remote work if remote work is typically available for their occupation.

TRANSPORTATION FUNDING LEGISLATION UPDATE. As you are aware, the Governor called a Special Legislative Session on August 29 to address a funding shortfall for the Oregon Department of Transportation. On September 1, the Oregon House of Representatives passed HB 3991 by the required

three-fifths House majority (or 36 votes) required for legislation increasing taxes (also passing HB 3992 declaring an emergency). The bills will now go to the Senate floor on September 17 for a vote. Prior to the House consideration and vote, the Joint Transportation Funding Committee on Monday, August 25 at 3:00 pm and took public testimony on LC 2, the bill that would increase gas taxes and income taxes by a combined \$6 billion over the next nine years to fund state and local transportation maintenance, restore several hundred ODOT jobs, and add funding to local transit districts. <u>PERMITTING REFORM</u>. The RACC joined more than 500 local and state chambers and business organizations across the U.S. calling on Congress for comprehensive permitting reform. The U.S. Chamber of Commerce delivered the coalition letter to Members of Congress on September 2. Modernizing permitting systems will empower communities and businesses to invest in infrastructure that grows the economy, creates good-paying jobs, and improves quality of life. The coalition united around four key principles:

- **Predictability:** Clear timelines and scope for project reviews.
- **Efficiency:** Improved interagency coordination to optimize resources.
- Transparency: Accessible visibility into project milestones and schedules.
- Stakeholder Input: Consistent opportunities for input from all relevant parties.
