In addition to the above, Wilhelms will also provide a brief discussion on an OBI initiative to repeal ORS 195.530 (HB 3115) related to restrictions on local governments' ability to manage and enforce unsanctioned public camping. The Roseburg Area Chamber recently took a position of support for any legislation, initiative and/or ballot measure that would repeal HB 3115 (ORS 195.530). The program presentation is also expected to identify what business may expect to see in the upcoming 2026 Oregon Legislative Session.
